Recognizing the Best: The OPRA Governor's Award

The OPRA Governor's Award recognizes the one award from all of the first place winners, that has made the most significant impact in the lives of Ohioans. The award winner will be announced by the Governor of Ohio or his designee during the awards ceremony. A \$500 donation is awarded to the winning parks or recreation foundation. State leaders will serve as the judging panel for the award with the following criteria:

- Project, program, or event is impactful on community quality of life
- Project, program, or event is unique/innovative, or presents a new way of doing something
- Project, program, or event addresses a need recognized in the community
- Project, program, or event is utilized by the community

- Display how your agency is improving the quality of life in your community;
- Earn your agency acknowledgement;
- Demonstrate the caliber of your organization's work;
- Showcase your organization's talents and dedication to the parks and recreation profession;

Outstanding Leadership Awards

Recognizing outstanding leaders who have advanced the benefits of parks and recreation in Ohio. No entry fee. Awards in the Outstanding Leadership categories are voted on by the OPRA Board of Directors. Award notification will be sent the week of November 18, 2024.

Describe the primary reason this person is being nominated for a Leadership Award and explain how the nominee has enhanced parks, recreation, and quality of life in your community and/or Ohio.

Outstanding Youth Leadership

Presented to an outstanding leader 12-18 years of age who has enhanced parks and recreation in their community and/or Ohio.

Outstanding Citizen

Recognizing an outstanding citizen, volunteer, or community board member who has enhanced parks and recreation in their community and/or Ohio.

Youth Sports Coach of the Year

Recognizing an outstanding youth sports coach who has positively affected youth sports and has served as a role model for athletes in their community and/or Ohio.

Jack Hanna Resource Conservation*

Presented to an OPRA member who has dedicated their career to the conservation of natural resources as exhibited by leadership in conservation both in their career in parks and recreation and in other efforts.

Public Official of the Year

Presented to an outstanding elected official who has advanced the cause of parks and recreation in Ohio.

Harvey Woods Lifetime Achievement

Harvey Woods served as a parks and recreation professional not only in his day-to-day tasks, but also by mentoring young professionals and serving OPRA and NRPA. This award is presented to an outstanding individual who has emulated this work within parks and recreation in Ohio.

Professional of the Year*

Presented to an OPRA member who has served in the field of parks and recreation and has provided outstanding service to their community and OPRA. Please also describe their contributions to OPRA.

*This category requires the nominee to be a member. Please confirm eligibility before submitting nomination.



OPRA Hall of Fame

The Hall of Fame is the highest award given by OPRA. Hall of Fame inductees will have made a significant statewide contribution to parks, recreation, and natural resources which is demonstrated through specific and tangible accomplishments over the course of the individual's career. Nominations should detail those statewide contributions and accomplishments and the candidate's career contributions to OPRA. Up to two (2) recipients may be selected.

Please provide a detailed explanation of why the individual deserves this award as well as a summary of the contributions impacting parks, recreation, and natural resources in Ohio at the local, state, and/or national level.

Awards of Excellence Categories

Recognizing excellence in projects, programs, and events that enrich the quality of life and strengthen Ohio communities.

PROJECTS

Capital Improvement

Development or redevelopment of parks, facilities, or historical buildings/properties that advance the goals of parks and recreation agencies.

Cat. 1 - Up to \$500,000

Cat. 2 - \$500,000 to \$10 Million

Cat. 3 - \$10 Million and Up

Cat. 4 Management Innovation

Noteworthy contributions to parks and recreation through inspiration, incentive, and leadership initiatives; excellence in management, education, and staff development.

Cat. 5 Marketing Innovation

New or unique ways to communicate programs, stories, and/or benefits of parks and recreation that keep communities up-to-date and informed. Entrant must manage projects, with outside assistance limited to support functions such as printing, technical, and production services.

Cat. 6 Natural Resources & Conservation

Sustainable, significant contributions of an agency toward long-range planning and quality of services within the area of park facilities and natural resource acquisitions/development which positively impact Ohio's environment.

PROGRAMS & EVENTS

Recognizing parks and recreation agencies that are progressively providing enjoyable, enriching, and engaging experiences for their communities.

Cat. 7 Adaptive

Programs or events that enhance the lives of those with special needs such as emotional, cognitive, or physical disabilities.

Cat. 8 Environmental & Interpretive

Programs or events focused on nature; including environmental awareness, natural interpretation, or conservation.

Cat. 9 Health & Wellness

Programs or events focused on healthy lifestyles for community health or employee wellness.

Cat. 10 Historical & Cultural Arts

Historical reenactments, celebrations, fine arts, or similar programs or events of a cultural nature.

Cat. 11 Law Enforcement

Exemplifies innovative training, public programs or events, special units, or constructive plans that have significantly and positively improved law enforcement operations.

Cat. 12 Community Events

Events showcasing a creative, innovative, or distinctive interpretation to a general theme.

Cat. 13 Recreational Programs

Creative programs spotlighting an innovative approach to a general theme.

RULES

Submission Deadline:

(Narrative and Supporting Documents)

October 16, 2024

Cost is \$60 per submission. Group members will receive one free submission; discount will be applied to the first submission received.

Projects, programs, or events must be completed between October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024. For capital improvement projects, please use the date of your grand opening. For ongoing programs, please use the date of the last completed program or session within the above time period. For events, use the event date.

Applications must be submitted by a current OPRA member.

Projects, programs, or events can only be submitted in one category.

Submissions are not permitted to be entered two years in a row.

The Awards Committee reserves the right to reassign applications to the most appropriate category.

All submissions are submitted online at www.opraonline.org.

Awards Submission Information

FOR PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, & EVENTS (Cat. 1-13)

When applying online, please be prepared with the following information:

1. Award Category
2. Project/Program/Event Name
3. Date Completed
4. Cost of Project (Cat. 1-3 Only)
5. A narrative description of the project, program, or event not to exceed 7000 characters (letters, numbers, punctuation, and spaces count as characters) which addresses the following:

1. Community Impact

The project, program, or event addresses a community need, provides broad community benefit, is attentive to issues of diversity, equity and inclusion, and generally serves to improve the quality of life of the people in the community.

2. Achievement

The project, program, or event achieves stated goals in a measurable way.

3. Innovation

The project, program, or event is innovative, creative, presents a new way of doing things, is new to the field of parks and recreation, and provides a model which can be replicated.

4. Execution

The project, program, or event is strategic, utilizing specific

strategies, tools, resources, engagement, and outreach in order to accomplish goals.

5. Sustainability

The project, program, or event is sustainable and/or provides sustainable benefits to the community.

6. Resourcefulness

The project, program, or event creatively uses available resources including community partnerships, sponsorships, grants, and volunteers.

7. Storytelling

The project, program, or event utilizes available resources to clearly articulate the benefits of the project, program, or event to the community. The application materials clearly describe the project, program, or event and its benefits.



GET INVOLVED IN THE JUDGING PROCESS!

The project, program, and event submissions will be judged by parks and recreation professionals from around Ohio. The top three (3) scorers in each category will receive awards. Ties will be broken by the Awards Committee.

Judging will take place beginning at 10am, Thursday, November 7, 2024 virtually.

Award notification with media release will be sent to winning agencies the week of November 18, 2024.

All entries receive a summary of the judging sheet and comments. Additionally, all submissions will be available for viewing by members on the OPRA website.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS (CAT. 1-13)

Supporting documents are to be uploaded at the same time as the narrative. You may submit a maximum of 10 image files, 5 PDF files, and 5 hyperlinks. One image file is required with each submission.

- All supporting documents must have been made for the project, program, or event and not created specifically for the awards submission.
- Image files may be photographs, maps, artwork, screen captures, etc.
- Photographs may not contain borders, captions, or collages. Photographs must be high resolution.
- One document per PDF. Please save all PDFs to the lowest resolution possible. Examples of PDFs include flyers, posters, brochures, plans, calendars, or newspaper articles.
- Hyperlinks include website pages and links to videos (youtube, vimeo, facebook, etc.). Videos will not be accepted as an original file (ex: .mov).
- All images and PDFs need to be less than 10 MB each.

By submitting an application, you are granting OPRA permission to use any and all portions of the application, including photos, on our website and in marketing materials.
