Summary of Project Objectives and Participating Agency:

The Seneca Parks applied for and was granted the OPRA Foundation Program Development Grant with a request of \$2,500.00, to assist with purchasing equipment so that paddling programs could be developed for the citizens of Seneca County. This grant provided a part of the funding required to completely accomplish the purchase of sixteen kayaks and the corresponding kayak paddles and personal floatation devices (PFDs, aka life jackets) for safety while floating. The Seneca Parks also purchased a kayak trailer with additional grants to transport these units.

Description of Project Activities and Final Timeline:

The Seneca Parks encourages individuals and families to participate in programs, regardless of prior experience. This project has helped to further the general public's education on the skills and enjoyment of viewing our great community's natural features and beauty from the water's perspective, and will continue to do so for many years to come.

Evaluation of Outcomes and Impact:

Program Participation This Year: Even with the delay of the planned improvements of the ODNR Abbott's Bridge Scenic River Access at Steyer Nature Preserve that were initially planned to be completed before June, attendance at programs held at Garlo Heritage Nature Preserve throughout the summer was impressive.

In the 8 paddling programs that were offered to the general public this year, there were over 100 participants. Kayaks were also used during special programs such as five different summer camps. Summer Camp participation was much higher than expected this year, with 184 participants (and other adult helpers not included in numbers).

In total, over 284 people participated in the paddling programs.

Comments from those in attendance were extremely positive and appreciative of being able to take their first ride ever in a kayak!

<u>Description of Subsequent Plans:</u>

Next year, with the reopening of the ODNR Abbott's Bridge Scenic River Access at Steyer Nature Preserve and the addition of a new site with potential access across from the current ODNR St. John's River Access, expanded programming is being prepared to enable use of the kayaks at multiple locations for programs. Cooperative programming discussions for next year with another local partner, Camp Glen, have also begun.
