Created a National Trails System

The National Trails System was established, doubling the mileage of trails on federal lands and nearly tripling the mileage on state lands.





Ohio law prohibits the operation of a **bicycle under the influence** of drugs or alcohol. Many people are surprised to learn that **bicycle** OVI carries the same consequences as a **drunk** driving charge in **Ohio**. Even if you are cited for an OVI while on a **bicycle**, it will affect your driving priviledges. Mar 28, 2015 Your ideas!!
